Fellow CDSOA members **Nora and Peter van der Kam** are hosting a barbecue at their place in Maine on **July 16th**. Peter says:


"The CD's can remain anchored and/or rafted-up in the deep part of **Little Kennebec Bay** in front of our house (coordinates: **N 44°38'**; **W 67°27'**, see **Figure #1**) in **Roque Bluffs (near Duck Cove)**. You can dinghy in or be picked up in my 14' aluminum outboarder, preferably at high or on a rising tide (10' to 14' tides) and access the house by steps from the small beach.

Please notify me either by completing the [online registration form](#), by e-mail ([pepermuntje@bigfoot.com](mailto:pepermuntje@bigfoot.com)), or by phone here in PA (610-296 8086) or in Maine (207-255 4236) or on my cell (610-331 9406). We will have to know with some time in advance so that we can prepare ourselves by actually being there and for acquiring or borrowing tables, BBQ, chairs, food and what have you. Only requirement is **BYO booze and your favorite dish** if you like. We can do it outside if you like mosquitoes or inside if you don't like them. We can offer a shuttle to town to buy stuff if needed, or a sight seeing tour, or the opportunity to do some work in the yard or on the house.

I have actually asked Nora if she's for it and she said sure. We do look forward to doing this even though we don't own a CD (not yet - I did bid on Ed's CD14 on eBay but was outbid the next day) and assume that real members will not mind being guests of an (yech!) associate member....


**NOTE:** The night before, or while awaiting the right tide to enter Little Kennebec Bay and dinghying to the house, boats can anchor in **Roque Island Harbor** (see **Figure #2**), a beautiful Bay off Roque Island, well worth the effort. If you're early you can swim or row to the beautiful beach and fraternize with the natives. Mud Hole in Great Wass Island is an alternative although the excitement you will experience getting in there may turn you off for good. Mistake Harbor is also fun to get in."

By the way, Peter and Nora, who are now essentially boatless (Cape Doryless anyway), are the previous owners of a Cape Dory 30 that they called *Sgt. Pepper* and sailed on Chesapeake Bay. Peter is a past Commodore of the CDSOA and is presently Secretary for the Chesapeake Fleet.
